By Train

Topinoja Waste Management Centre – Guided tour and introduction to modern waste management

Location: Topinojantie 100, 20380 Turku

Ruissalo Botanical Garden – Researching climate change and testing water management solutions

Location: Ruissalon puistotie 215, 20100 Turku

Ruissalo is a ca. 7 x 2 km island within the City of Turku, characterized by southern climate and large, protected oak forests.

The Botanical Garden on the island of Ruissalo contains thousands of plant species both in greenhouses and in the outdoor garden – an excellent testbed for experiments in controlled terrestrial environments. The garden has many functions in education, public awareness raising, and supporting multidisciplinary research on climate change, biodiversity, and the sustainable use of natural resources. The guided visit will feature a general presentation of the garden and an introduction to its water management approach ensuring removal of different pollutants, including microplastics.


